The Friends is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization that's purpose is to provide support for the Belén Public Library. ## **Bookstore Manager's Report**

Books on Becker, the Friends' secondhand bookstore, launched with great excitement in August 2018 and entered 2019 on an upbeat note.

The store is a true community project, supported by the Belén Mayor, City Council, and Public Library. Bookstore proceeds are a critical source of funding support for Library programs.

The bookstore is organized into four rooms of fiction, two rooms of nonfiction, and a children's room. Fiction offerings include novels, short stories, crime/thrillers/mysteries, science fiction, Christian fiction, romance, and young adult books.

Nonfiction topics include biographies, art, music, poetry, theater, sports, Bible-based religion, New Age and Eastern philosophies, and humor.

Our inventory is diverse, often in "like new" condition, and remarkably inexpensive. Most hard-cover and trade paperback books are \$1.00 and mass-produced paperbacks are 25 cents. Even specially priced books like coffee-table and vintage books are an incredible bargain.

Children, teens, and teachers may take home up to two free books on each visit. We donate surplus books to the Library's free bins, the Maximum Security Prison library, several outlying communities, the Heart of Belén free library, and the Belén Community Center.

Major events of 2019 were as follows:

- We gave up a large children's section for the Bugg Lights Museum but in return gained more rooms. With generous donations and trips to secondhand stores and yard sales, we obtained almost enough bookshelves to fill our rooms. There are still spots where we would like to replace short bookshelves with tall ones, if anybody has a donation in mind.
- We survived an extreme rain event and flood on October 4. Despite a marvelous, quick response with sandbags from the Belén Fire Department, the City shut us down due to health and safety concerns. With loads of woman- and man-hours by dedicated volunteers, we were able to reopen three weeks later with a cleaner, brighter, more open, and better organized bookstore.
- In August, we shut down the store for one day and celebrated a successful first birthday with a potluck provided by the volunteers.

## **☑** Everybody Counts

There are many good reasons to respond to the 2020 Census. The top one: it's so easy! You'll be able to respond online, and the Belén Public Library is a designated Questionnaire Assistance Site.

Perhaps you're unsure of your computer skills or the reliability of your internet connection. Perhaps you've never responded before or aren't sure how to respond. Or perhaps you want to avoid having census workers come to your home. Whatever your situation, the Library can help.

Even if you don't have a library card, you can use their computer stations. Plus, on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays from March 12 through April 30, trained assistants will help you navigate the census website. If you have questions about this service, call the Library at 505-966-2600.

Valencia and Socorro Counties are considered "hard to count" census areas. If we're under counted, New Mexico will miss out on a lot of federal dollars for vital healthcare, nutrition, education, and infrastructure programs. So when you receive your census postcard, take ten minutes and answer just ten questions online. There is no citizenship question, and responses are confidential. Even if you don't receive a postcard, you <u>must</u> respond between March 12 and April 30.

Yes, participating in the census is the law, but do it for your friends, your family, your neighbors, your community. And let the Library help!
