

## Go Places with the Book Club

Long ago Saint Augustine said, “The world is a book, and those who do not travel read only a page.” And vice versa, I say: A book is the world and those who read only one page do not travel.

The Belén Friends Readers' Group book club had several delicious tours through time and space booked for the next few months, but COVID-19 restrictions that temporarily closed the Belén library have postponed our cruises. With our March and April meetings canceled, we've had to delay our group's gourmet tour from Mumbai to London to a small town in France with Richard Morais's *The Hundred-Foot Journey*. Also delayed is our visit to the planet Rakhat by way of Puerto Rico, Istanbul, and the Vatican with *The Sparrow* by Mary Doria Russell.

At this writing, the status of our May 18 meeting is undecided. Meanwhile, upcoming book club journeys include Ireland with Mary Pat Kelly's historical family saga *Galway Bay* and Mexico's Gulf Coast fishing towns with John Steinbeck's classic *The Pearl*. Other visits explore the complexities of life for Chinese-Americans and African-Americans with Celeste Ng's *Everything I Never Told You* and *The Color of Water: A Black Man's Tribute to His White Mother* by James McBride.

Do our reading selections whet your appetite? You'll find some enthusiastic readers and extraordinary books at our monthly meetings, and new participants are always welcome. We usually meet on the third Monday of each month at 10:00 a.m. in the public meeting room (it's a rather noisy group) at the Belén Public Library. The meeting usually adjourns between 11:30 and 12:00, or more accurately, moves on to a local restaurant for lunch.

Members take turns choosing books for each month. The selections usually balance out between fiction and non-fiction. The two semi-rules are:

- ▶ The chooser should have already read the entire book.
- ▶ Try not to choose something you suspect everyone will hate.

In December of 2019 we began a year-long experiment using a new program. The Farmington library's Book Kits to Go program sends 13 copies of the chosen book every month to participating library book clubs around the state. Local book clubs choose from a list of over 200 books. Our selection for January was Ann Patchett's novel *Bel Canto*. The February book was *The Boys in the Boat* by Daniel James Brown. Copies of *The Hundred-Foot Journey* and *The Sparrow* were received from Farmington but cannot be distributed until the Belén library re-opens.

## A Call for Bookstore Volunteers

Those of you who have visited Books on Becker, a 501c3 project of the Friends of the Belén Public Library, know what a wonderful little gem we have sitting in the heart of the Belén Arts District. The moment you walk in the door you know that adventure awaits, knowledge is at your disposal, and bargains are abundant.

What you may not know are the individual names, faces, and strengths of those who have spent countless hours over the past two years making Books on Becker the greatest little nonprofit bookstore in New Mexico. They are all uniquely different but have one common characteristic that unites them—they are all volunteers who make a difference in our community by generating funds for children, youth, and adult programs at the Belén Public Library, as well as college scholarships for local high school seniors.

Our volunteers warmly greet bookstore patrons and proudly give store tours to first-time visitors. Volunteers share their love of reading and help visitors find their next favorite book. When browsing turns to buying, they tally and bag books, take payment, and stamp frequent shopper cards. Often, they make on-the-spot decisions such as giving a patron that sixth book when he only has enough cash for five. Volunteers who work during store hours typically work from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. one day a week. We are open Wednesday through Saturday.

Behind the scenes, our volunteers use their individual strengths in other ways. They can be found transporting and mounting donated bookshelves or sorting, culling, and shelving donated books.
