

Pari has just completed a novel about Belen, titled Belen Hitch, which is now at the publisher's. The writing of Belen Hitch required Pari to spend time in our community for research and interviews. Pari's already published book is Clovis Incident, copies of which will be available for purchase and signing at the meeting. She is now working on Plaicitas Peril. LIBRARY RENOVATION PLANS PRESENTED TO CITY COUNCIL

Thank you, members of the Friends of the Library, for turning out in such numbers at the October 4 Belen City Council meeting to support your library! At that meeting, John Pate, an architect with Molzen-Corbin & Associates, on behalf of the library's Board of Directors presented to the City Council preliminary drawings for library renovation and expansion. The Council approved the plans and placed the library as Number 2 on its list for the 2005 legislative session. Council comments included: (1) the renovation and expansion is sorely needed; (2) the number of people who came to the meeting to show their support for the library was impressive; (3) library renovation and expansion is not only exciting but a sign of a healthy and educated community; and (4) the Council will try hard to secure the required funds, estimated at \$1 million.
