RENOVATION PROPOSED FOR BELEN PUBLIC LIBRARY

Since the beginning of this year, the Board of the Belen Public Library has been considering expansion and renovation of the existing library building. The current structure was built 20 years ago, and although the book collections are still maintained and housed with adequate space, increased requirements for library services and significant technological advances necessitate expansion of the facility.

Four areas that require additional space have been identified. (1) Staff workspace - The original library was built with workspace for only one staff member. The library now has four additional staff, and the Director of the Library has inadequate office space. (2) Children's reading room and Adult Literacy Pro-

gram - Children's reading programs and adult literacy programs are quite successful and continually growing. (3) Meeting/presentation room - The room is the site of many local meetings and special presentations and should be able to accommo-(Continued on page 2)


IS A BOOK CLUB IN YOUR FUTURE?

NM Voters Consider \$16,112,000 Bond for Libraries

In November, New Mexico voters will be asked to approve a \$16.1 million bond package to fund the purchase of books and other materials, such as periodicals and electronic databases. This 2004 Bond breaks down as follows:

- 5.832 million for New Mexico Public Libraries: To be distributed on a per capita basis to New Mexico libraries as supplementary funding to purchase books, electronic information resources, and the tools needed to share information. Statewide, this is about \$3 per capita, or less than the cost of one paperback book.
- \$6.156 million for publicly funded school libraries/juvenile detention libraries: To be distributed with both a minimum per school amount and a per student allocation. On average, this amount will purchase 1 to 2 books per student.

- \$3.8 million for academic libraries: To be distributed on a formula basis to all academic libraries in the state. This amount will purchase 1 to 2 library books, or other materials, such as electronic databases, for each full-time student in a New Mexico college or university.
- \$324,000 for two State Libraries: To acquire library books, equipment, and materials for the State Library and the Angelico Chavez History Library.

Once again, as in 2002, this bond has the potential to make a difference to all New Mexico libraries big and small. The last statewide library initiative was the 2002 Library Capital Improvement Bond which passed with 409,317 votes, the highest positive vote of all state bonds in 2002. This 2004 Bond proposal is endorsed by the New Mexico Library Association and the State Library Commission.

Summer Reading Program Supported by Friends

Registration for summer reading programs at the library began Wednesday, June 9. Readers from age 3 to 18 are participating. Young readers ages 3 - 12 can join the READiscover New Mexico/Leido descubra Nuevo Mexico program. They must read or listen to four books, fill out a reading log, and submit it for an incentive program. The Read-New Mexico Teen Reading Incentive Program is for young adults ages 13 - 18. Readers submit logs to earn raffle tickets for prizes, which will be awarded on Tuesday, July 20, during the program's teen pizza party. The party will also include storyteller Rosalia de Aragon as La Llarona, the Wailing Woman.

A significant portion of the budget of the Friends of the Library goes to support these worthwhile programs (see the budget on the next page).


