FRIENDS ANNUAL MEETING MARCH 26

The annual meeting of the Friends of the Library is scheduled for Sunday, March 26, 2006, at 2 PM at the library. All Friends and their friends are invited to attend the gathering which will begin with a regular business meeting of the Friends Board and the election of officers for 2006-2007. The Nominating Committee will present these nominations: Tami Wiggins, President; Pat Boyle, Vice-President; Donna Hernandez, Treasurer; and Bernice Boyle, Secretary.

The second part of the event will feature a presentation by Kathy and Lance Chilton, writers and founders of LIBRO, a reading project sponsored by Lovelace. Together with friends, they wrote New Mexico: A New Guide to the Colorful State and then Touring New Mexico, both published by UNM Press. Each book took 6 years of work. Lance followed up this writing experience with many articles and short stories, and now writes a regular column in the Albuquerque Journal. Kathy continued the experience with more illustration work for UNM Press, the Museum of New Mexico Press, and a variety of other books. Both Kathy and Lance are involved with literacy projects. They work with the "Read to Me Campaign" and a literacy program in Oaxaca, Mexico. Kathy says, "Books have always been important in our lives. Not only have books informed, amused, entertained, and challenged us, but volumes also insulate the walls of our home, weigh down gluing projects, and keep us awake (or put us to sleep) at night." Kathy and Lance live in Albuquerque.



LIBRARY RECEIVES FUNDING

Expansion and renovation of your library, first proposed just two years ago, could begin as early as this summer, thanks to Legislative appropriations of \$1.1 million.

The library was designed in 1984 when no one could imagine the changes the Internet would bring to libraries. On any given day, 160 people visit the library's computer labs, and the library hosted more than 42,000 computer sessions last year. During the past five years, attendance at library programs such as the Readers' Group, Literacy Program, book sales, and computer workshops has increased by 200%. Many events are held in the public reading room because the meeting room has seating for only 50 people. This means computer labs are closed and public reading is disturbed. The Children's library is so small that it can house only 1,700 books. With nearly 5,000 students in the Belen School District, that is only one-fourth of a book per child.

The City of Belen had the foresight to purchase the entire block of 300 Becker Avenue, preserving ample room to add on to the existing library. A challenging aspect of this project was to design an addition to the building large enough to meet needs while leaving sufficient space for parking. The Becker Street project, with its diagonal parking, helped alleviate this problem. The final design (1) maximizes the parking lot, adding 6,000 square feet of new space, (2) doubles the library's size, and (3) compliments the existing structure. John Pate of Molzen-Corbin & Associates, the designer of the original library building, has created preliminary renovation and addition plans that include:

- · A Teen Power Library with patio entrance
- New, expanded public restrooms
- · 1,000 linear feet of additional shelf space
- A children's library twice the size of the current one, with a family learning center
- A public meeting room with seating for 100 and a utility kitchen
- 1,200 square feet for technical services/storage
- Easy access for the disabled

The Friends continues to seek ways to increase its building fund which will go toward furnishings such as kitchen appliances, artwork, seating, and tables. (Use the form on the back page if you wish to make a donation to the building fund.)

The Board of the Friends thanks all those who wrote letters and e-mails and made phone calls to legislators to request their support of this funding. "You see a library; we see a future!"

- Donating books. Almost any kind of book will be accepted but children's books are especially needed.
