LOCAL AUTHOR FEATURED AT ANNUAL MEETING

Location Is La Mirada Hotel's Event Center

Lisa Polisar, an Albuquerque author, will be the guest speaker at the annual meeting of the Friends of the Belen Library. The meeting will be held at 2 PM on Sunday, March 25, 2007, at the event center at La Mirada Hotel, 2200 Camino del Llano in Belen. This event is free and open to the public.

The meeting will begin with a brief business meeting and the election of officers for 2007-2008. (See the nominations box on page 2.) The second part of the meeting will feature a presentation by Lisa about her third mystery thriller, The Ghost of Mary Prairie. Lisa developed a love of mysteries through reading Nancy Drew, Sherlock Holmes, and other popular fictional detectives. In 1989 Lisa did graduate work in psychology at the University of Exeter in England where she developed a fascination with the psychology of crimes and criminals. She has published two other mystery thrillers: her first novel, Blackwater Tango, was published in 2002, and a New Mexico mystery, Knee Deep, followed in 2003. Lisa officially launches The Ghost of Mary Prairie in Albuquerque the day after the meeting.

DIRECTOR PROVIDES CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Beverly McFarland, Director of the Belen Public Library, recently attended a renovation and progress meeting about the library. She says that the construction project is progressing well despite some weather and soil problems. The framing is finished as well as much of the electrical. A new roof, sprinkler system, and new light fixtures will be completed soon. Everyone's doing a great job!

Beverly also indicated that after water problems on the east side of the building were addressed, the soil there was stabilized and the grade is being raised. The



forms for the addition's foundation should be set within the next few weeks. The work is a little behind schedule, but John Pate, the project architect with Molzen-Corbin, believes some of the time lost will be made up during good weather. The building should be substantially complete by August 2007. A bit further along in the project, a time table will be set for the move back to the new facility.





FRIENDS PROVIDES GENTLE REMINDERS ABOUT ...

... LIBRARY SERVICES AND TEMPORARY LOCATIONS

- "The Bookstop," at the Belen Recreation Center at 715 S. Main, contains a limited selection of books.
- The computer lab is at the Belen Community Center, 325 Multipurpose Rd.
- The library's mailing address is still 333 Becker Avenue, and the phone number remains 864-7522.
- Both locations operate Monday through Thursday from 9 AM to 6 PM, and Friday from 9 AM to 5 PM.
 The computer lab is open on Saturday from 9 AM to noon, but the Bookstop is closed.
- The book drop is located just outside the front door of the Recreation Center on South Main.
- You must bring your library card to the Bookstop since access to patrons' computer records is not
 available there. If you wish to renew a book without your card, call the number listed above or visit
 the computer lab at the Community Center.
- The cart with dollar books is at the Bookstop. The cart also holds Friends membership materials.

... THE ANNUAL BOOK SALE

- The next annual book sale is now planned for October 19 and 20, 2007. Proceeds of the sale fund children's reading programs at the library.
- BOOKS ARE NEEDED, especially children's books. Laura Hawes, Book Sale Chairperson, would be happy to coordinate with you either to pick up your books or to meet you at the book storage facility for a drop-off. Call Laura at 861-1925.
- A facility for book storage is also needed. Once library construction is complete, the Friends' arrangement with Belen Consolidated Schools for storage space expires. If you know of or can donate a ground-floor storage space of 200 to 300 square feet, please contact Laura Hawes at 861-1925.
- Folding tables for use at the book sale are an additional need. If you buy a table, your name will be
 prominently displayed on it to show your support of the Friends and the sale.
- There are many volunteer opportunities associated with the sale besides moving books and setting them up: pre-sale phoning, coordinating the book-moving effort, putting up and taking down sale signs, and more. Call Laura at 861-1925.


... FRIENDS DONATIONS AND MEMBERSHIP
