## SIMMONS HIGHLIGHT OF ANNUAL MEETING



Dr. Marc Simmons, "New Mexico's best known and most distinguished historian" (UNM Press), will be the guest speaker at the annual meeting of the Friends of the Belen Public Library. The meeting will be held on Sunday, March 30, 2008, at 2:00 PM in the new library's lecture hall. This event is free and open to the public.

The meeting, the inaugural event of the lecture hall, will begin with a brief business meeting and the election of officers for 2008-2009. (See "Officer Nominations Sought" on page 2.)

The main portion of the meeting will feature a presentation by Dr. Simmons, an independent scholar and author who has published 45 books on New Mexico history. His writing, research, and lectures have focused on Spanish colonial New Mexico, the Santa Fe Trail, and the life and times of Kit Carson. Another of his special interests is El Camino Real. His fourth grade social studies

book, New Mexicol, was first published in 1984 and has been through several editions. Early in his career, he worked as a horseshoer and apprenticed with noted blacksmith Frank Turley of Santa Fe. Together they published the standard Southwestern Colonial Ironwork: the Spanish Blacksmithing Tradition. For 35 years Simmons has written a weekly history column that has appeared in various regional newspapers. In 1993 King Juan Carlos of Spain admitted him to the knightly Order of Isabel la Católica for his contributions to Spanish colonial history.

After his presentation, a reception will be held to honor Marc, and refreshments will be served. Please join the Friends for this event Sunday, March 30!






