
SEN. BINGAMAN HEARS LIBRARY PLANS

FRIENDS RAISE FUNDS FOR BUILDING PROJECT

The Friends of the Library continues to work hard to raise funds for the renovation and expansion of your library.

The most exciting activity may be the raffle of a signed special edition of J.K. Rowling's newest book, Harry Potter and the Half-Blood Prince. Fifty signed books were made available, one for a library in each state, and the Belen Library won New Mexico's only copy. The Library Board voted to donate the book to the Friends so that it could be raffled as a fund raiser for the library's building fund. Tickets sell for \$1 each or \$10 for a book of 11 and are available at the library, businesses around town, and at special civic events. The sale ends Dec. 16, and the drawing will be held Dec. 19. Special thanks go to the Raffle Committee, which formed quickly and organized the raffle effort in record time: Donna Hernandez, Committee Chair and Friends Treasurer; Katherine Trujillo, Assistant Library Director; Ronnie Torres, Belen Mayor; and Friends members Elise Acree and Barbara Price.

The annual Friends book sale is scheduled for the last weekend of October. You can buy a whole bag of books for only \$1! Volunteers are encouraged to help with sale set up at the library at 9 AM on Thursday, Oct. 27. Members of the Friends are invited to the preview portion of the sale, complete with refreshments, on Friday, Oct. 28, 2-5 PM. Then on Saturday, Oct. 29, sale to the general public is 9-2 PM. All book donations are welcome, especially children's books. Due to space limitations, the library cannot accommodate book donations, so call Tami at 864-3700 to coordinate donations.

The Friends also had a table at the Belen Farmers' Market several times this summer. The sale of books, popcorn, soft drinks, and bottled water raised more than \$200. Thanks to Friends and friends of Friends George Boyle, Sylvia Brady, Rhiannon Dent, John Hernandez, Mike Racine, and Edith Schulz. Future appearances of the Friends include the Fall Festival on Saturday, Oct. 15, and the Parade of Lights on Saturday, Nov. 26. LIBRARY BOARD MEETS WITH FEATURED GUEST

Last quarter's meeting of the Board of Directors of the Belen Public Library was a unique and special one. Mark Wunder, Sen. Jeff Bingaman's Field Representative from Albuquerque, was the featured guest at the gathering, held Monday evening, September 12. The meeting began with dinner at Pete's Café. During dinner, members of both the Library Board and the Board of the Friends of the Library answered questions from Mark about the library and discussed with him library needs and fundraising ef-

forts. Discussion topics included the unusually large size of the area served by the library, future trends in library design, and the current condition of the library. After dinner, the group moved to the library for presentations. Architect John Pate provided copies of the proposed floor plan and described the renovation and expansion project. Beverly McFarland, Library Director, gave Mark a tour of the library. The group then continued to discuss funding needs, the current use of the existing facility, and requirements for the expanded library. Mark commented that his office would investigate federal funding options, and he encouraged the group to continue its fundraising activities as well as its search for other sources of funding.

The more formal portion of the meeting began after the call to order and approval of the previous meeting's minutes. The Board officially approved the donation to the Friends of a signed special edition of the newest Harry Potter book (see top of page 2) and then heard the Director's Report from Beverly and the Friends of the Library report from Bernice Boyle, Friends' President. Following comments from Board members and guests, the date of the next meeting was set for Monday evening, December 12.
