LIBRARY BOARD MEETS SEPT. 13

The Board of the Belen Public Library, in a meeting on Monday, September 13, considered and discussed several topics. John Pate, an architect with Molzen-Corbin & Associates, presented preliminary drawings for library renovation and expansion. Renovation will include a larger office for the library director and a staff workroom. Expansion will include a 5,300-square-foot project/meeting room with a kitchen, seating for up to 100 people, and a teen library. The area can be closed off from the library and used for meetings and banquets when the library is closed. In addition, the children's library will be enlarged. The Friends of the Library has been asked to encourage as many members as possible to show support for the library by attending the Belen City Council meeting on Monday, October 4, at 7:00 pm when Mr. Pate will present these preliminary plans to the Council.

Another topic at the meeting was "GO Bond C," which is one of four bond issues on the November ballot. Passage of Bond C: Library Books Acquisitions would benefit all New Mexico cities, towns, and villages by providing funds to replace outdated, worn-out, and lost books with new books, educational materials, electronic resources, and computer upgrades. The legislation had widespread bipartisan support and was signed by Gov. Richardson. The Belen Public Library would receive \$70,318, and an additional \$87,816 would go to the Belen School District. The Friends of the Library encourages you to vote FOR this bond issue on November 2.

Beverly McFarland, Director of the library, reported on several items. She and the library staff attended a training conference, and she provided a library services report and an activity summary for June 1 - August 31. Ms. McFarland also told the Board that reconfiguration of the current project room will begin on November 1. The room will be divided in half: the west half will be incorporated into the children's library as a temporary expansion to provide much-needed space, and the east half with the sink and cabinet will remain as the project room.

Friends of the Library President Bernice Boyle provided information about several Friends activities. She remarked that 11 people have joined the Friends since July and that the library's book club is up and running (see page 2). She also outlined the Friends upcoming annual book sale (see page 3).



The third meeting of the group was Monday, August 27, and included lively and thought-provoking discussion of *The Master Butchers Singing Club* by Louise Erdrich.

Young Readers Participate in Summer Reading Program

The summer reading program at the library began Wednesday, June 9, and continued until Tuesday, July 20. More than 500 readers from age 3 to 18 participated and read 2,280 books! Participants submitted reading logs to earn raffle tickets for prizes. The Bethlehem Masonic Lodge donated three bicycles for prizes for the program. Kieona Montoya, 4, won the bike for the pre-school through second grade group. Zane Nunez, 9, was awarded a bike for the third grade through sixth grade group. And Gloria Martinez, 14, won the teen mountain bike.


OCTOBER MEANS ANNUAL BOOK SALE TIME

The Board's responsibilities include adopting long- and short-range plans for the library's growth, supporting the library director, reviewing and recommending any changes to the library budget, fulfilling the legal and professional responsibilities of trustees, and keeping informed of library developments.
