YOUR LIBRARY IS CHANGING!

You've been hearing about plans for renovation and expansion of the Belen Public Library for months, and now it's about to begin! Library staff is already hard at work preparing to close the library September 30 and move operations and materials from the existing building to temporary facilities. During October, the library will be closed while books and other materials will be moved or packed for long-term storage. Temporary quarters will open November 1:

Library books and deliveries: Belen Recreation Center, 715 S. Main

Computer labs: Belen Community Center, 325 Multipurpose Rd. Construction should be complete in the spring of 2007, and the improved and expanded library will re-open at its original location at 333 Becker Ave. The library phone number will still be 864-7522, and the existing book drop behind the library will remain in use until the contractor starts work in that area. Here's the project schedule:

Sept. 2006 - Project out for bid; library closes Sept. 30

Oct. 2006 - Library closed; Friends book sale at City Hall Oct. 20&21

 Nov. 2006 - Nov. 1 library reopens in temporary quarters; Nov. 6 bid awarded; Nov. 28 notice to proceed

April 2007 - Project completed; library reopens at 333 Becker Ave.





BOOK SALE IN OCTOBER

Thanks to Laura Hawes, Book Sale Chairperson, and her husband Don, the Friends annual book sale Oct. 20 and 21 will be bigger and better than ever. Since a sale of this size requires volunteers, call Laura at 861-1925 to sign up to assist, especially with sale preparation on Thursday, Oct. 19, or post-sale activities on Saturday afternoon, Oct. 21. On Thursday, boxes of books need to be moved from storage at the Belen Consolidated Schools Support Services area on North Main to City Hall downtown, where the boxes must be unpacked and books placed on the appropriate tables. Saturday afternoon, what books remain after the sale must be packed and moved back to storage.

The actual sale begins on Friday afternoon, Oct. 20, with a special preview sale for Friends members only. Books will be for sale for only \$1 per bag. This buck-a-bag sale opens to the public on Saturday, Oct. 21. You can become a member of the Friends of the Library at either sale.

Since the library will be closed in October, Sally Garley, Belen City Manager, and Mayor Ronnie Torres agreed to give the Friends use of City Hall for the sale and have gone "above and beyond" to accommodate us. Thank you!

For the October 30 meeting at June's, read any book or essay by Mark Twain; *The World Is Flat* by Thomas Friedman is the selection for November 27. Everyone is welcome at the Group's meetings on the last Monday of each month at 10 AM. Meetings are informal, and membership in the Friends is not required. 
BELEN LIBRARY OFFERS VARIETY OF PROGRAMS

Your library provides or hosts a variety of programs ranging from computer labs to a readers group, from cross stitchers to story hours, and some of these are supported in part by the Friends of the Library. For instance, read about the **Readers Group** on page 2. And the **summer reading program** again succeeded in drawing young people into the library and motivating them to read. Prizes at the end of the program included bicycles provided by the Belen Masonic Lodge No. 56. Also, the **Children's Programs** have just resumed. Story Hour on Tuesdays is a structured program, and children are required to attend regularly. Thursday's Tales for Tots gets back to story time basics and does not require registration, though children must be accompanied by an adult. For more information about
